

How to lock your bike



- Never leave your bike unlocked. The majority of bike theft is opportunist driven.
- Never lock your bike up somewhere quiet where a thief can work undisturbed - lock it up somewhere public, busy and well lit.





 Do not lock your bike to a signpost. It is easy for thieves to unscrew the sign and lift your bike over the top of it.

 Use a D lock (AKA U lock) to secure your frame and rear wheel to the secure stand. Use a second lock on the front wheel round a secure stand to keep it secure. This is especially

important with quick-release wheels.

 Alternatively, remove your front wheel, place it alongside your rear wheel and use a D lock to secure your frame and wheels to a secure stand.

 When using multiple locks choose different types of lock e.g. a D lock and a cable lock. Each lock type requires a different tool to break it.

 When buying a lock, look for the Sold Secure logo. Sold Secure Pedal Cycle Gold

of security.

 Make the lock mechanism hard to reach and use your bike and the stand to fill the space within your lock. The less space inside the lock the less room there is for leverage.

- Keep your lock off the ground so thieves have nothing to strike against.
- To prevent the theft of individual components, replace quick releases on your bike (e.g. seat clamp) with Allen head bolts or security bolts available from specialist bike shops.
- Remember to remove all accessories from the bike before leaving it; including lights, computers and panniers etc.
- Make a note of your bike's frame number, usually found beneath the bottom bracket.
